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How To Accept That You've Come Down With A Case Of Bieber Fever



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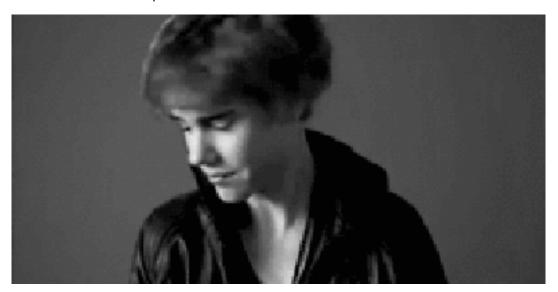

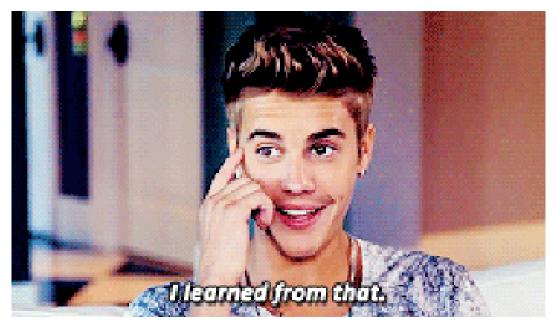
